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Help Wanted: Projections of Jobs and Education Requirements through 2018
Report from The Georgetown University Center on Education and the Workforce to be released June 15

While the nation remains fixated on the economic wreckage in our rearview mirror, we are hurtling towards our economic future unprepared. Many of the jobs lost in the recession are not coming back. Most of the jobs that will survive and grow will require postsecondary education.

The Georgetown University Center on Education and the Workforce presents a new approach to projecting jobs and education demand that answers some critical questions about the emerging economy, including:

- When will the jobs come back?
- Where will the jobs be? Which states? Which industries? Which occupations?
- What postsecondary certificates and degrees will be required?
- Will the education system be able to keep up?
- How much will it cost to fund the postsecondary education America needs?

WHAT: Release and discussion of Help Wanted: Projections of Jobs and Education Requirements through 2018

WHO: Anthony P. Carnevale, Director of The Georgetown University Center on Education and the Workforce will be presenting findings from the report. Representatives from key sectors including government, education, business, and labor will be on hand to discuss the report's projections and its implications on the U.S. workforce.
